LAUREATE AWARDS

The Laureate Award honors Fellows or those elected to Mastership of the College who have demonstrated by their example and conduct an abiding commitment to excellence in medical care, education or research and in service to their community, their Chapter, and the American College of Physicians.

AWARDEE: EVE KERR, MD, MPH, MACP

Eve Kerr, MD, MPH, MACP currently serves as the Kutsche Memorial Chair in Internal Medicine, Division Chief of General Medicine at the University of Michigan and Senior Investigator of the VA Center for Clinical Management Research. Dr. Kerr completed her medical degree at the University of California, San Francisco, and completed her residency and MPH in Epidemiology from UCLA. Following completion of her MPH, Dr. Kerr joined the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Clinical Scholars Program before becoming a member of the faculty at the University of Michigan in 1996. Her prior administrative roles include serving as the Founding Director of the Michigan Program on Value Enhancement in the Institute for Healthcare Policy and Innovation at Michigan Medicine.



Dr. Kerr has dedicated her research career to improving quality, value and equity in healthcare delivery and has been an important voice in the conversation on workforce equity and well-being. Her research has been well funded throughout her career and she currently serves as a co-investigator on de-implementation of low-value testing in patients undergoing low risk surgery, optimizing Veteran decision-making about use of VA and non-VA health care, assessing episode based surgical quality in VA and community care settings and peer mentoring to overcome obstacles for midcareer women clinician-scientists in academic medicine.

Dr. Kerr is recognized for her scholarship, leadership, and mentorship. She was elected to the National Academy of Clinical Investigation, selected for Mastership by the American College of Physicians, and recognized by the VA Undersecretary for Health with the Excellence in Health Services Research Award as well as by the Society of General Internal Medicine with the John M Eisenberg National Award for Career Achievement in Research.

AWARDEE: JOHN MAURER, MD, FACP



John Maurer, MD, FACP earned his medical degree from the University of Iowa and completed residency at Blodgett Memorial Medical Center at St. Mary's Hospital in Grand Rapids. Following residency, he practiced at Grand Valley Medical Specialists providing outstanding primary care and had a faculty appointment at Michigan State University, where he was promoted to the rank of Associate Professor.

Dr. Maurer has held several important leadership roles over his career. He has served as Associate Program Director (1984-89) and Chief of Staff (1995-96) for Blodgett Memorial Medical Center and was a member of the Board of Trustees for Blodgett Memorial from 1995-97. He continued in his role on the Board of Trustees with Spectrum Health from 1997-2005 and served as the Chair of the Board of Trustees from 2005-07.

Dr. Maurer has been a longstanding and committed member of the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians Governor's Council, has been involved as a member of the Medical Advisory Committee for Hospice of Greater Grand Rapids and as a Member of the Board of Trustees for Hospice of Michigan.

AWARDEE: DAVID PAJE, MD, MPH, FACP



David Paje, MD, MPH, FACP is a Clinical Professor in the Division of Hospital Medicine at the University of Michigan. Dr. Paje currently splits his clinical time between the Ann Arbor Veterans Affairs Hospital and Michigan Medicine. He completed his medical degree at the University of the Philippines and his residency training at Wayne State University/DMC before joining the Henry Ford Medical Group as Senior Staff Physician. He has held several leadership roles over the course of his career including Associate Division Head of Hospital Medicine at Henry Ford, Associate Medical Director for Health Alliance Plan, Associate Program Director of the Henry Ford Internal Medicine Residency Program, and Director of the Medical Short Stay Unit at Michigan Medicine.

Dr. Paje's clinical interests focus on thrombosis and anticoagulation, as well as vascular access. He has been involved in the Michigan Hospital Medicine Safety Consortium, where he co-leads a state-wide multi-hospital quality improvement project on PICC/ midline usage. He is also contributing to developing evidence-based practice guidelines with the Association for Vascular Access.

Throughout his career, Dr. Paje has received numerous honors and awards, including being named a Top Reviewer by the *Annals of Internal Medicine* multiple times and receiving the Raymond H. Murray Governor's Award from the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians.. He is a former co-chair for the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians Annual Meeting and an active member of the Governor's Council for the Chapter. He has served on several national and international committees, including the Clinical Practice Guidelines Writing Group for the Association for Vascular Access, and speaks regularly to national audiences of health professionals and institutional leaders about the development and management of observation and short stay units.

INTERNIST MOST COMMITTED TO INDEPENDENT PRACTICE AWARD

This award recognizes a clinician who shows ongoing contribution to an independent primary care internal medicine practice in Michigan and is a long time member of the Chapter. Other notable attributes include a demonstrated dedication to teaching, research or the business of medicine and a commitment to staying up to date with best practices in Internal Medicine.

AWARDEE: NASIR ABBAS KHAN, MBBS, FACP, MRCP (UK)

Nasir Abbas Khan, MBBS, FACP, MRCP (UK) earned his M.B.B.S. degree from King Edward Medical College in Lahore, Pakistan, and went on to complete his internal medicine residency at Butterworth Hospital in Grand Rapids, Michigan. He also holds a Membership in the Royal College of Physicians from the United Kingdom.

Since 1997, Dr. Khan has served as an internist and attending physician at Mercy Health Physician Partners in Grand Rapids, Michigan. His leadership roles include serving as Lead Physician in the Internal Medicine Department and as Associate Program Director for the Grand Rapids Medical Education and Research Center, Department of Internal Medicine, Michigan State University in Grand Rapids. As a clinical professor, Dr. Khan has been instrumental in mentoring medical students and residents, guiding them through their educational and professional journeys. His dedication to teaching has been recognized with multiple Outstanding Teacher Awards.

Dr. Khan's research contributions are notable, with numerous publications and presentations. Among his many accolades, Dr. Khan has received the prestigious Larry Feenstra Award for Lifetime Achievement from the Grand Rapids Medical Education and Research Center. He is recognized by his peers as being a compassionate physician, great teacher, lifelong learner and someone who advocates for his patients and learners.

AWARDEE: WAEL SALMAN, MD, FACP

Wael Salman, MD, FACP completed his medical degree at Tishreen University Faculty of Medicine in Latakia, Syria, followed by a pediatric residency at Damascus University Children's Hospital. His medical training continued in the United States, where he completed an internal medicine residency at Hurley Medical Center, Michigan State University College of Human Medicine.



Dr. Salman has served as Staff Internist at Memorial Healthcare in Owosso, Michigan since 1996 and held several leadership roles over that time ranging from Chair of the Credential Committee, Chief of Staff and later Chair of the Department of Internal Medicine. Dr. Salman's dedication to improving healthcare delivery and patient outcomes is reflected in his continuous involvement in administrative and clinical excellence.

Dr. Salman's contributions to the medical community have been recognized through multiple awards, including the 2011 Physician of the Year and 2012 Humanitarian of the Year at Memorial Healthcare. His colleagues nominating him for this award shared how hard it is to maintain an independent practice as a physician, and reflected on how Dr. Salman has continued to work to own and manage his own practice.

GREAT INTERNIST OF MICHIGAN

The Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians recognizes internists whose contributions to health care and internal medicine in Michigan have been noteworthy. Criteria for the award are outstanding clinical abilities and performance, along with service to the discipline, research and/or education. Such individuals should be members of the chapter, but their work on behalf of internal medicine does not need to be on behalf of the Michigan Chapter of ACP.

AWARDEE: DIANE LEVINE, MD, MACP

Diane Levine, MD, MACP is a Professor in the Department of Internal Medicine at Wayne State University School of Medicine. In addition, she currently serves as the Vice Chair of Education, Internal Medicine Clerkship Director and Director of the Patient Safety and Quality Improvement curriculum.



Dr. Levine's commitment to excellence in teaching and patient care has been recognized with numerous awards and honors throughout her career. Notably, she has been repeatedly listed among the Best Doctors in America, and she has received the Wayne State University President's Award for Excellence in Teaching. Her peers and students alike have acknowledged her exemplary mentorship and educational contributions, culminating in multiple Staff Awards from the senior class for her ability to blend the art, science, and life of medicine.

Beyond her academic and teaching roles, Dr. Levine is actively involved in various professional organizations and scholarship aimed at improving medical education and patient care. She has participated in national and international conferences, where she has presented workshops on interprofessional education, patient safety, and quality improvement and has over 50 peer reviewed publications and over 75 published abstracts over her career.

AWARDEE: ANUPAMA NAIR, MBBS, FACP



Anupama Nair, MBBS, FACP completed her medical degree at the Medical College of Trivandrum, University of Kerala followed by her internship at Medical College Hospital Trivandrum in India and then residency at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, Michigan. She is currently the Associate Division Head of General Internal Medicine and a Senior Staff Physician at Henry Ford Health. She holds an appointment as Assistant Clinical Professor at both Wayne State University School of Medicine and Michigan State University College of Medicine.

Throughout her career, Dr. Nair has been involved in leadership and quality improvement initiatives, including her current roles as a member of the Primary Care Leadership Forum Planning Committee, as Physician Lead in the Academic Internal Medicine Clinic, and Associate Director of Ambulatory Quality and Medical Education in the AIM Clinic. She serves at the institutional level at Henry Ford Health as a member of the Board of Governors for the Henry Ford Medical Group (HFMG), where she represents primary care. While on the board she has been a member of the Nominations Committee and served as the committee Vice Chair. She currently is a member of the HFMG Board of Governors HR Subcommittee.

Dr. Nair's dedication to medical education is evidenced by her recognition as the Teaching Physician of the Year for General Internal Medicine and the William C. Keimig Patient Centered Team Care Award. She has also been active in scholarship and has published several papers on efforts to improve cancer screening in the primary care setting, telemedicine, and diabetes care. Beyond these roles, Dr. Nair has served the community with volunteer work at COVID vaccination events and as the Doctor-on-call for several years for the MAI Family Services Annual Walkathon against Domestic Violence.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The Michigan Chapter of the ACP also honors a member who has demonstrated a lifetime commitment to the American College of Physicians with a Lifetime Achievement Award. Recipients of this award are either Fellows or those elected to Mastership and are universally looked upon as Chapter leaders, advisors and mentors.

AWARDEE: PATRICK ALGUIRE, MD, MACP



Patrick Alguire, MD, MACP earned his medical degree from Michigan State University College of Human Medicine and completed his residency in internal medicine at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor. Dr. Alguire took his first faculty position at Michigan State, where he spent time as the Clerkship Director and Assistant Program Director before transitioning to the role of Program Director. While Program Director, Dr. Alguire also took on the role of Division Chief for General Internal Medicine and was Co-Director of the Primary Care Faculty Development Fellowship. Dr. Alguire later transitioned to a role at the University of Florida, where he was actively involved in leadership as part of the Health Information and Medical Records Committee, Harrel Center Advisory Committee and Chairman of the Faculty Development Advisory Committee.

Dr. Alguire has been involved in medical education throughout his career including roles on the USMLE writing committee, as a member of the USMLE Content Based Standard Setting Committee, and as Chairman of both the Digital Imaging Task Force and Applied Anatomy Task Force. In 1998, Dr. Alguire took on the role of Director of Education and Career Development with the American College of Physicians and was instrumental in leading the work of MKSAP, a resource that the internal medicine community relies on for board prep.

Dr. Alguire's dedication to teaching and mentoring has been recognized with multiple awards, including the Distinguished Clinician Award from Michigan State University, the Outstanding Alumni Award from Michigan State College of Human Medicine, the Educational Development Award by the Clerkship Directors in Internal Medicine, Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award and the Laureate Award from the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American College of Physicians in 2015 and from the Michigan Chapter in 2022. Dr Alguire was awarded Mastership of the American College of Physicians in 2022.

AWARDEE: RAYMOND HILU, MD, FACP



Raymond Hilu, MD, FACP earned his medical degree from Wayne State University and completed his Internal Medicine Residency at the University of Michigan. Following residency, he joined the faculty at St. John Hospital in Detroit and quickly thereafter joined the residency program leadership team. Dr. Hilu is the current program director, a role he has had since 2010. Dr. Hilu also had academic appointments as Associate Professor at Wayne State University School of Medicine, St. George University School of Medicine, and Central Michigan University.

Dr. Hilu has been the recipient of numerous awards over the course of his career, including multiple “Teacher of the Year” honors from St. John Hospital and Wayne State University. He was recognized by the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians for his long-standing commitment and contributions to the Chapter with the Governor’s Award in 2009 and the Laureate Award in 2017.

Dr. Hilu’s impact extends beyond teaching, with significant contributions to research and professional development. He has authored numerous publications and presentations on topics such as antibiotic usage, HIV care, and innovative teaching methodologies in medicine. His leadership within professional societies, including the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians, is marked by his role as a frequent judge, past program chair at ACP scientific meetings and active member of the Governor’s Council.

AWARDEE: GEETHA KRISHNAMOORTHY, MD, FACP



Geetha Krishnamoorthy, MD, FACP earned her MBBS from Madurai Medical College in India, followed by a rotating internship as Resident Medical Officer and time in special training in Psychiatry before transitioning to the U.S. Dr. Krishnamoorthy completed her Internal Medicine residency and was later appointed as Chief Medical Resident at Wayne State University Sinai-Grace Hospital. She is Clinical Associate Professor at Wayne State University and Ross University School of Medicine, and is Program Director of the Internal Medicine Residency Program at St. Joseph Mercy Oakland Hospital. She cares for patients in both the inpatient and outpatient settings.

Dr. Krishnamoorthy is actively involved in various hospital and professional committees, ensuring the continued development and oversight of educational and clinical programs. She serves on the Clinical Competency Committee, Program Evaluation Committee, and

Medicine Advisory Committee at St. Joseph Mercy Oakland, where she helps shape the curriculum and assess resident performance. Additionally, she is a member of the Root Cause Analysis Committee and the Oakland Intensivists Council, focusing on patient safety and clinical improvements.

As an educational leader, Dr. Krishnamoorthy has led numerous board review courses and developed educational programs that support the development of clinical skills. She received the Teaching Excellence Award from the St. Joseph Mercy Oakland Internal Medicine Residency Program in 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022. She also received the Leonard C. Alexander Award for “Best Teacher, Role Model, Clinician and Friend” a total of 10 times, voted on by internal medicine residents at Sinai-Grace Hospital. She has several peer reviewed publications on diverse topics and her mentorship has guided many residents and students in writing manuscripts and abstracts for academic conferences.

AWARDEE: MARK MCQUILLAN, MD, FACP



Mark McQuillan, MD, FACP is a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Michigan. He completed his medical training and residency at the University of Michigan Health System, where he also pursued fellowship training in clinical rheumatology. He was recognized for his excellence in clinical care with induction into the Clinical Excellence Society within the Department of Internal Medicine in 2014. His clinical interests include gout, pseudogout, syncope, and autoimmune disorders, and he has led multiple quality improvement projects and innovative educational programs in these areas.

Dr. McQuillan has been active in medical education as a faculty member, including supervising and educating residents and medical students as an attending physician on the General Medicine Inpatient Service, teaching medical students in the longitudinal clinical skills course at the medical school and as an active participant over the years in Intern Report, Ambulatory Morning Report, and noon conference. Dr. McQuillan has been recognized for his work with multiple awards including the Bronze Beeper as a resident, the Senior Class Award for Outstanding Teaching and the Kaiser Permanente Award for Excellence in Clinical Teaching.

In addition to his academic and clinical roles, Dr. McQuillan is a dedicated member of professional societies such as the American College of Physicians and the Society of Hospital Medicine, where he has served in leadership positions. Dr. McQuillan has been an active member of the Michigan Chapter on the Governor’s Council, as a past Co-Chair of the Annual Scientific Meeting, and as a regular judge of the medical student

and resident abstract and poster competition. He was recognized by MI-ACP with the Governor's Award in 2006 and the Laureate Award in 2011.

AWARDEE: MICHAEL ZAROUKIAN, MD, PHD, MACP, FHIMSS



Michael Zaroukian, MD, PhD, MACP, FHIMSS completed his medical training at Michigan State University College of Human Medicine, earning both his MD and PhD in Microbiology and Immunology. He pursued an Internal Medicine Residency at Michigan State University Associated Hospitals, where he later served as Chief Medical Resident. Dr. Zaroukian is currently Professor Emeritus at the Department of Medicine, College of Human Medicine, Michigan State University and Co-Chair of the Health Information Technology Commission with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. Throughout his career, he has held multiple leadership positions, including Vice President and Chief Medical Information Officer at Sparrow Health System, where he spearheaded major healthcare IT initiatives.

Dr. Zaroukian's extensive leadership experience includes serving as Chair of the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) North America Board of Directors. He has also been deeply involved with the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians, including as an active member of the Governor's Council since 1991 and as the Treasurer for the Chapter from 1994-2000 and 2006-2014. He has been involved with ACP at the National level as Past-Chair of the Clinical Problem-Solving Cases Authoring Committee and Past-Chair of the Medical Informatics Committee. His influence in advancing health information technology and patient care systems is recognized through his leadership roles with HIMSS and various health system boards, and he continues to contribute to shaping national health IT policy.

Dr. Zaroukian has 70 peer-reviewed publications and has contributed to significant advancements in electronic health records, clinical decision support systems, and medical education. His work has garnered him multiple accolades, including several naming him as one of the top leaders in healthcare IT.

JERRY YEE MENTORSHIP AWARDS

This award was created to honor the extraordinary legacy of Dr. Jerry Yee, who was a brilliant nephrologist, a compassionate physician, a prolific scholar, a passionate educator, and a hardworking servant leader. He was an MACP of the American College of Physicians, a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (London), and a recipient of numerous national awards and accolades that recognize his exceptional skills as a physician, educator, and leader.

This award recognizes internal medicine physicians with a commitment to supporting the scholarly and professional advancement of their students, trainees, and junior colleagues. They should demonstrate consistent and high-quality mentoring in clinical research, post-graduate scholarship or professional development.

AWARDEE: ERIC AYERS, MD, FACP

Eric Ayers, MD, FACP is Associate Professor of Clinical Medicine at Wayne State University School of Medicine and recently transitioned from Program Director for the Internal Medicine and Pediatrics Program to Associate Program Director. He earned his medical degree from Wayne State University and completed his combined Internal Medicine-Pediatrics residency at the Detroit Medical Center.



Dr. Ayers is actively involved in leadership roles at Wayne State and within the broader medical community. He serves on several key committees, including the Promotion and Tenure Committee, the Diversity and Inclusion Task Force, and the Learning Communities initiative at Wayne State. He also has a strong presence in the community, serving on the board of Black Family Development, working to improve the quality of life in Detroit. His contributions to diversity, equity, and inclusion in medical education have been recognized on both local and national levels.

In addition to his leadership roles, Dr. Ayers is known for his extensive mentorship of students, residents, and junior faculty. He has guided numerous medical students through the residency match process, participates in the writing of Medical Student Performance Evaluation letters for residency applications and has provided career advice and support for those entering the field of Med-Peds. Dr. Ayers has also developed educational programs that foster mentorship within learning communities, helping to shape future healthcare professionals. He has authored more than 20 peer-reviewed publications, focusing on areas such as adolescent health, healthcare disparities, and transitional medicine. His commitment to mentorship and education has earned him multiple awards for teaching, mentorship, and compassionate care. Dr. Ayer's mentee describes him in this way, "He is always there for his people and has their backs no

matter what. Stepping down to become Associate Program Director recently was to mentor his junior colleague into the new leadership role while ensuring adequate guidance, oversight, and support in the transition—an example of sheer dedication towards his peers and mentees, that goes above and beyond any personal accolades.”

AWARDEE: JOHN HOPPER, MD, FACP

John Hopper, MD, FACP earned his MD with high distinction from Wayne State University and completed his residency in a combined internal medicine and pediatrics program at the University of North Carolina Hospitals, where he also served as Co-Chief Resident in Pediatrics. Currently, Dr. Hopper is the System Chair of the Department of Internal Medicine at Trinity Health in Ann Arbor and holds academic positions at Wayne State University, the University of Michigan, and Georgetown University. He also serves as the Medical Director for the Chemical Dependency Unit at St. Mary Mercy Hospital and is the Medical Director for Patient Experience at Trinity Health IHA Medical Group.



Dr. Hopper has held other leadership roles over the course of his career including as Vice Chair for Education and Program Director for the Internal Medicine Residency Program at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital. He is involved in professional organizations including the American Society of Addiction Medicine and has co-chaired the Education Committee of the Michigan Chapter of the American Society of Addiction Medicine. Dr. Hopper is also a board member of the Washtenaw County Medical Society and served as President in 2022. He has been involved in the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians as a judge of resident abstracts and posters and past member of the Program Planning Committee. He was recognized by the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians in 2022 with the Laureate Award.

Dr. Hopper is a prolific contributor to medical research, with over 30 peer-reviewed publications on topics ranging from opioid management to smoking cessation and addiction treatment. He has given numerous presentations in these areas, including as a faculty member for the National ACP precourse on SAFE Opioid Prescribing. Dr. Hopper’s mentee shared this perspective, “Dr. Hopper himself has been a distinguished mentor who is non-judgmental and willing to guide those seeking great knowledge and understanding in the field, while teaching us that no matter what the disease, people still deserve our empathy.”

AWARDEE: JENNIFER LUKELA, MD, FACP

Jennifer Lukela, MD, FACP is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Internal Medicine at the University of Michigan. She holds a medical degree from Harvard Medical School and completed her residency and chief residency in Internal Medicine at the University of Michigan Health System. Dr. Lukela currently serves as Service Chief and Vice Chief for Clinical Strategy and Community Engagement in the Division of General Medicine at the University of Michigan. Dr. Lukela sees patients in the outpatient setting and has been recognized for her outstanding clinical care with induction in 2020 to the Internal Medicine Clinical Excellence Society.



Dr. Lukela is a past Associate Program Director of the Internal Medicine Residency Program, where she was the faculty lead for the Women's Health Curriculum and led the Medical Education elective for residents. She is the co-founder and faculty lead of "Equal Medicine" - a career development program aimed at supporting the professional growth of women in internal medicine, reflecting her dedication to promoting gender equity in medicine. This is a role she has maintained as she transitioned her leadership roles from the residency program to the Division of General Medicine. In addition to her academic and clinical roles, Dr. Lukela is actively involved in various professional organizations and committees. She has served on the Education Committee of the Society of General Internal Medicine and the TEACH Scholars Selection Committee.

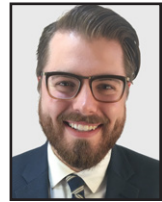
Dr. Lukela's research interests include gender disparities in medicine, clinical teaching skill development, and graduate medical education in ambulatory settings. She has published numerous peer-reviewed articles and presented her work at national and regional conferences. She is seen as a selfless mentor and her mentees summarize her contributions as, "Without asking for anything in return, she has repeatedly sponsored and promoted us in our careers, and it is clear that academically she puts her mentees above herself."

JAN RIVAL AWARDS FOR EARLY CAREER PHYSICIAN

Dr. Rival was a dedicated member of the Chapter and served as Governor from 1998-2002. He was a long-standing member of the Governor's Council and the recipient of the Laureate Award and Lifetime Achievement Award. He valued the opportunity to teach residents and those early in their careers. This award is given in his name to a physician who shows significant professional achievement in patient care, research and/or medical education and a promising career as a physician.

AWARDEE: ERIC EDEWAARD, MD

Abigail Entz, MD, FACP is a Senior Staff Physician in the Department of Internal Medicine at Henry Ford Hospital, where she sees patients in both the inpatient and outpatient settings. She earned her medical degree from Wayne State University School of Medicine, graduating with clinical honors, and completed her residency in internal medicine at Henry Ford Hospital, where she also served as Chief Medical Resident. Dr. Entz's commitment to medical education is evident through her roles as Internal Medicine Clerkship Site Director for Wayne State University and Community Clerkship Director for Michigan State University College of Human Medicine. Her dedication to teaching and mentorship has been recognized with multiple awards, including the Peter G. Coggan Outstanding Teaching Award and the Senior Resident Teacher of the Year Award.

Throughout her career, Dr. Entz has made significant contributions to medical education and clinical practice. She has developed innovative curricula, such as the Medical Student Curriculum Initiative to expand the learning experience of clerkship students who were rotating at Henry Ford, and she has been actively involved in mentoring residents and medical students through various programs and initiatives. Ginny Sheffield, MD is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Division of Hospital Medicine at the University of Michigan and VA Ann Arbor Healthcare System. She earned her medical degree with numerous academic honors, including Phi Beta Kappa and Alpha Omega Alpha, from the University of Michigan. Dr. Sheffield completed her internal medicine residency at the same institution, where she was recognized with awards such as the Andrew J. Zweifler Award for Excellence in Clinical Skills and the Kenneth R. Stark Internal Medicine House Officer Research Award. As a resident, she was recognized as an exceptional educator through her selection twice with the Bronze Beeper Award, an award solely awarded by the University of Michigan Medical Students. As a faculty member, she was recognized with the Senior Award by the Graduating Class of 2024. This award is given to a junior faculty member of the Medical School who, in the view of the graduating class, best exemplifies the ideals of a teacher-clinician.

Dr. Sheffield's academic contributions extend beyond teaching; she has been actively involved in various projects aimed at improving medical education and healthcare delivery. She currently serves as Associate Program Director for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Justice in the Internal Medicine Residency Program and is the Chair of the MI-ACP DEI Committee. In her roles at the medical school, she leads initiatives to integrate generative artificial intelligence in medical training and develops curricula to mitigate bias in student and resident evaluations. Her efforts have been supported by grants from the Macy Josiah Jr. Foundation and Michigan Medicine Wellness Office. Dr. Sheffield's work on responding to patient-initiated harassment and discrimination has been widely disseminated and evaluated for its effectiveness, showcasing her commitment to creating a safer and more inclusive healthcare environment.

Dr. Sheffield has also contributed to scholarship in her professional work. She has published numerous peer-reviewed articles on topics such as gender disparities in teaching evaluations and invasive fungal diseases. Nicholas Helmstetter, MD, FACP, FAAP is Assistant Professor at Western Michigan University Homer Stryker M.D. School of Medicine (WMed) and holds joint appointments in the Departments of Internal Medicine and Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine. He currently also serves as Associate Director of Street Medicine Kalamazoo, where he provides care to the city’s unhoused population and mentors residents and medical students. Dr. Helmstetter completed his medical degree with high distinction from Wayne State University School of Medicine and his residency in Internal Medicine-Pediatrics at Michigan Medicine in Ann Arbor.

Throughout his career, Dr. Helmstetter has been dedicated to advancing healthcare for vulnerable populations. He has played a pivotal role in developing and implementing evidence-based practices for addiction medicine, harm reduction, and primary care for the unhoused through Street Medicine Kalamazoo. His clinical expertise spans a wide range of areas, including medical-assisted therapy for opioid use disorder, adolescent and young adult health, and point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS). Dr. Helmstetter’s leadership extends to multiple committees at WMed, including the Pain Management Work Group and the Gold Humanism Honor Society Selections Committee, where he contributes to shaping medical education and healthcare practices.

Dr. Helmstetter has received numerous awards, including the Michigan Chapter ACP Jan Rival Early Career Physician Award and the Outstanding Clinical Science Educator award at WMed. He has several peer reviewed publications, is a subrecipient of SAMHSA’s PCSS-Universities “MI CARES 3.0” to encourage medical school collaborations to train medical students on treating persons with a substance use disorder and has also received grants from the Michigan State Medical Society Foundation, Kalamazoo Community Foundation, and the Irving S. Gilmore Foundation to support the WMed Street Medicine efforts.
