ACP OHIO Poster Competition Guidelines

- 1. Participants should check in at the ACP meeting registration area to obtain their nametags and poster board assignment prior to setting up their poster in the Poster Area. Each presenter has been assigned a specific poster board number so please check in with ACP staff before setting up.
- 2. The poster board surface is approximately 4' high by 6' wide. However, please try to keep your poster to 3 ½' x 3 ½' in accordance with national guidelines. The boards have a cork surface so that push pins can be used to hang. <u>YOU</u> are responsible for bringing pushpins.
- 3. You are asked to make no major alterations in the text of your abstract. This is strictly a poster competition. Therefore, laptops with slide shows are not permitted as part of your presentation.
- 4. Each presenter will be asked to give a 4 minute "presentation overview" of their work, leaving 6 to 10 minutes for a question-and-answer session with the judges. Student winners will be announced at the Recognition Reception on Friday evening. Resident winners will be announced at the Thursday evening Awards Reception. Results will also be posted on the Chapter website the week following the Scientific Meeting.
- 5. The resident and student who receive the highest score on his/her poster is eligible to move on to the abstract competition at the National ACP meeting to be held in the Spring of 2025 in New Orleans, LA. In addition, cash prizes are awarded to several of the resident and students who receive top scores for their poster presentations.
- 6. First authors are allowed to present one poster. If the first author is unable to present, a second author will be allowed to present the poster if they are eligible and a member of ACP. NO EXCEPTIONS. Please contact Jan Wrassman if you cannot present your poster.
- 7. Please RSVP to Jan Wrassman no later than August 15th if you are planning to attend as a poster presenter.
