

Do you need health coverage? Resources are available to help you find and enroll in health insurance.

If you need health insurance, you may be able to purchase it through the health insurance marketplace. Even if you are young and healthy, it is important that you get health insurance. Health insurance gives you the peace of mind of knowing that you will be covered and be able to afford your medical expenses if you have an accident or get sick. Depending on your income, family size, and a few other factors, you may qualify for financial assistance that will lower your premium and cost sharing.

Resources for Patients:

Find help online: Open enrollment in the federal government-run health insurance marketplace begins on November 1 and ends on January 15. State-run marketplaces may have a longer open enrollment period. You may be able to enroll outside of open enrollment if you have a qualifying life event, like the birth of a child or marriage. Those who are eligible for Medicaid may enroll at any time throughout the year.
